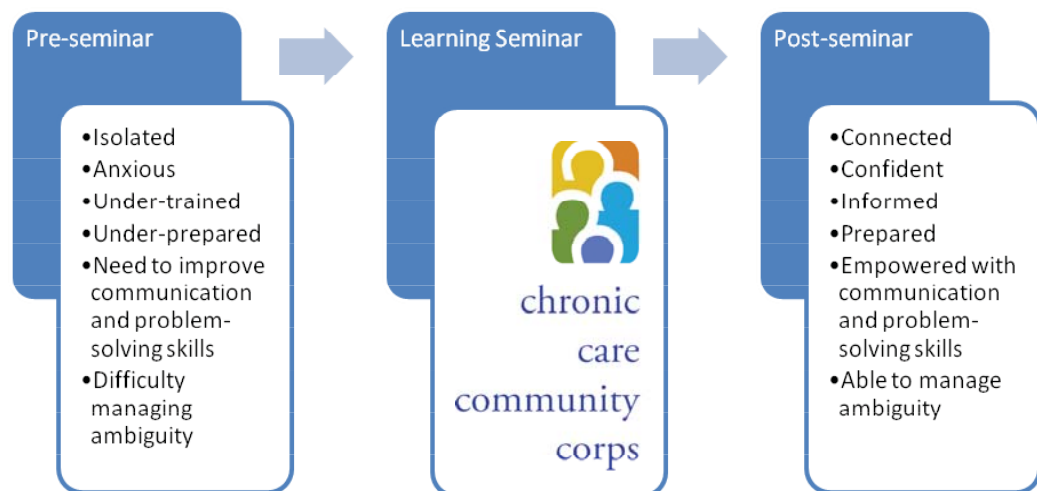
Learning Seminars
