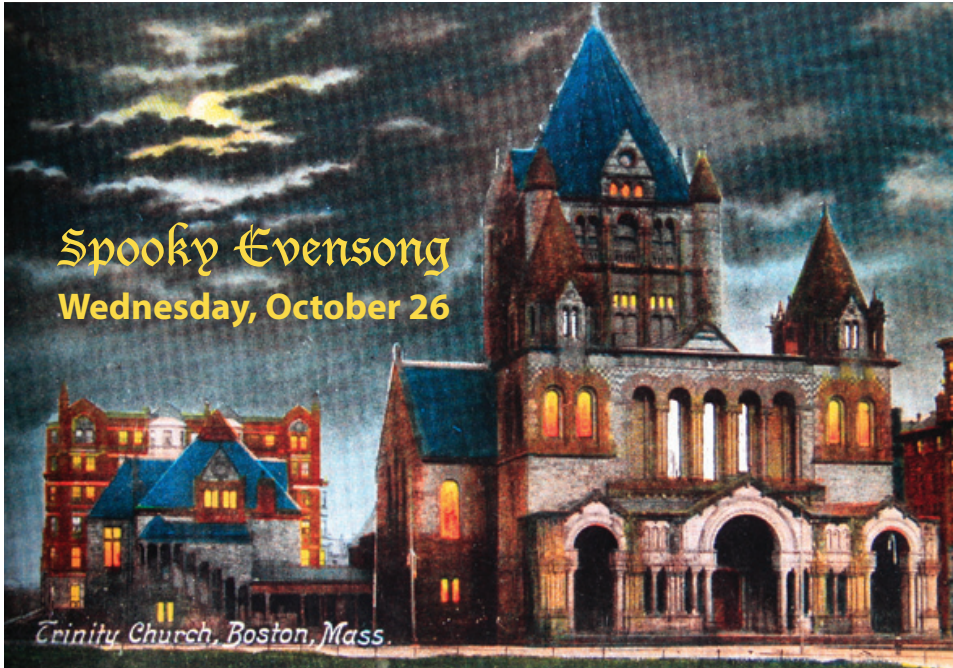

### Julie Sloan and the Restoration of La Farge's 'Christ Preaching' Window

Tuesday, November 1, 7:00 pm, Forum

John La Farge's 'Christ Preaching' (1883) — newly returned to the church after a multi-year restoration — is Trinity Church's crowning glory and one of the artist's most significant windows. 'Christ Preaching' continues to be ranked among the finest works in stained glass in America. In this window La Farge combined several of his most innovative features. The most striking of these is its monumental clustering of broken jewel-work in shades of blue and green that fill the West Wall with an ever-present and glimmering sky. With its architectural and decorative features and entering figure of Christ, the window is closely joined to the actual sanctuary, not only to its own architecture and decoration, but its purpose as a "preaching and teaching" church. **Julie Sloan**, consultant to the restoration, will explore the window's history, design, and restoration and La Farge's relationship to Trinity Church.
