Conference, United Church of Christ. She has been a retreat leader, writer, and environmental activist for more than thirty years. A founding member of Massachusetts Interfaith Coalition for Climate Action, and a leader in New England Regional Environmental Ministries, she was arrested with 21 others in prayer outside the U.S. Department of Energy in Washington, DC, in May 2001. She was arrested in an
