Welcome to the season after Pentecost at Trinity Church.

We are glad you are here today. This booklet will be your guide for Sunday worship here through the end of October. We are now in the longest liturgical season of the year: the time of the formation of the church.

Having walked and prayed and sung—through the Advent of Jesus, the Epiphany manifestations of God in Christ, the penitential pilgrimage of preparation in Lent, the intensity of the Passion in Holy Week, and the joyous season of the mystery of the resurrection in Eastertide—we are in the midst of the time where we, the Lord's people, are learning to be the body of Christ.

At Trinity, we mark the liturgical seasons with predictable variations. For the fall, the congregation will sing the Invitatory Psalm, known as the *Venite*, found on the facing page.
