The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The congregation remains seated, as the candidates and their families stand.
The service continues in the Book of Common Prayer, p. 301, with the presentation and examination.

After all have been presented, the Presider invites all to stand, as they are able.

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ? **We will.**

Making & Renewing Baptismal Vows

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Do you believe in God the Father? ***I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.***

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? ***I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.***

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

I will, with God's help.

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? *I will, with God's help.*
Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ? *I will, with God's help.*
Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? *I will, with God's help.*
Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being? *I will, with God's help.*

A candle is given to the sponsors with these words:

N., receive the light of Christ and take it into the world. *Amen.*

After the candidates have been baptized, all stand.

Gracious God, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

Let us welcome the newly baptized. *We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.*
