

## ABOUT EASTERTIDE

When we are very small, we do not grow tired of stories. We want to hear them again, and yet again, until our carers groan and roll their eyes. But our small selves hunger to be inside the story, to become, through hearing it, at one with it.

This is what we do as Christians: we tell each other the story, again and yet again. “Christ is risen!” we tell each other. But we do not see this every day. The daffodils bloom for a week or two, then die; the tulips follow in their turn. For us, as for them, there is no shortcut through decay and death.

How shall we know this truth so foolish that it shames the wise? Christ lives, and so shall we! God’s will toward fruitfulness and flourishing cannot be checked by any powers that exist! It is a truth so grand, we cannot hold onto or understand it. All we can do—and what we must do—is tell one another, over and over, until it makes its way into our very marrow: The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!
