### THE LESSONS

#### Psalm 118:1-2,14-17,21-24

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; \* his mercy endures for ever.

- Let Israel now proclaim, \* "His mercy endures for ever."

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#### Gospel Matthew 28: 1-10

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. #### The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. #### Easter Table Prayer

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise. Glory to you for ever and ever.

At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home. By your will they were created and have their being.

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another. Have mercy on us, Lord.

Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your only Son, born of a woman, to fulfill your Law, to open for us the way of freedom and peace.

By his death, he reconciled us. By his wounds, we are healed.

And therefore, on this Sunday of the Resurrection, we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with all those in every generation who have looked to you in hope, to proclaim with them your glory, joining in that hymn we sing when we gather:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest!

Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest! This prayer draws upon the language and imagery of Eucharistic Prayer C, in The Book of Common Prayer (pp. 369-372). Therefore, as Jesus modeled, We now bring before you the gifts of our Easter tables, and, knowing that you gather with us wherever we are, we ask that the meals we share on this day and always would be holy, and, fed by you, that we would always be your holy people.

God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; God of Sarah, Rebecca, and Rachel; God of our Lord Jesus Christ: Open our eyes to see your hand at work in the world about us.

Deliver us from the presumption of coming to our Easter table for comfort only, and not for strength; to meet our needs only, and not in service of the whole world's needs, and let the gift and grace of this meal and every meal, bind us in your Christ.

And now, as our Savior Christ now taught us, we are bold to pray:


Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name,
