

Note on today's soloist

James Walsh, a Tenor from London, England, began singing at the age of 11 as part of the Tiffin Boys' Choir in Kingston-Upon-Thames. As a treble he sang and toured extensively with them. He sang as part of the children's chorus at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden, later playing several solo roles. James obtained his Bachelor of Arts in Music from Princeton University where he sang with Trinity Church, Princeton, was Assistant Director of the Princeton University Glee Club, and was Music Director of Princeton's oldest a cappella group, The Princeton Nassoons, directing them at Carnegie Hall and for the Royal Family of Liechtenstein. He obtained his Masters in Voice from the New England Conservatory in 2017, where he studied with Carole Haber. His credits include solo oratorio work with the Leipzig Barockorchester, and several Main Stage roles with Princeton Opera Theatre and NEC opera. James has performed extensively with many Boston areas choirs since, including with the St. Paul's Choir of Men and Boys, Harvard Square, where he has been on staff for the last five years.

Gospel Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around him, they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled

hands?" He said to them, "Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is

'This people honors me with their lips,

but their hearts are far from me;

in vain do they worship me,

written,

teaching human precepts as doctrines.'

You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition."

Then he called the crowd again and said to them, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile." For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."




