From the Historian: The Gertrude Parker Window

Dear Trinity Church and friends,

When Charles Henry Parker died in 1908, at the age of 92, the student newspaper *Harvard Crimson* noted that he was the last member of the Class of 1835. A devoted member of Trinity Church, Parker's family ties to the church stretched back to its beginnings. His grandfather was Bishop Samuel Parker (1744-1804), the fourth rector of Trinity Church, who led the congregation during the Revolutionary War and served the parish until his death in 1804. Parker's father Samuel Dunn Parker (1781-1873), a lawyer, was a graduate of the Harvard Class of 1799, and an active member of parish.

Like his father, Charles Henry Parker earned a law degree and was a very successful businessman. And like his forefathers he was active at Trinity serving as a vestryman and Warden for fifty years. He was twice married and had



eight children. His second wife was Mrs. Laura Wolcott Jackson. Among their children was Gertrude born July 22, 1865. She had barely begun to follow in her family's tradition of faith when she died at the age of 18 of typhoid fever.

Parker and his wife commissioned famed painter and stained-glass designer John La Farge to produce a window in their daughter's memory.

The Gertrude Parker Window, located in the Parish House (formerly the Trinity chapel), depicts a young girl holding a lamp and by her side a pot of lilies. Surrounding the scene is a bold display of ornamental glass in hues of gold, red, blue and green. An inscription reads, "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God."



The story set in glass visualizes one of the wise virgins from the parable of the wise and foolish virgins. Today the window is most often referred to as Purity.

A 300-piece puzzle of the Gertrude Parker window is now available in Trinity's Shop! You can visit the Shop in the Narthex, Tuesday-Saturday from 10 am-5 pm.



WORD OF GOD

Reading Genesis 12:1-9

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

So Abram went, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot, and all the possessions that they had gathered, and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan. When they had come to the land of Canaan, Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. Then the Lord appeared to Abram, and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the Lord, who had appeared to him. From there he moved on to the hill country on the east of Bethel, and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east; and there he built an altar to the Lord and invoked the name of the Lord. And Abram journeyed on by stages toward the Negeb.

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 33: 1-8 Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous; * it is good for the just to sing praises. Praise the Lord with the harp; * play to him upon the psaltery and lyre. Sing for him a new song; * sound a fanfare with all your skill upon the trumpet. For the word of the Lord is right, * and all his works are sure. He loves righteousness and justice; * the loving-kindness of the Lord fills the whole earth. By the word of the Lord were the heavens made, * by the breath of his mouth all the heavenly hosts. He gathers up the waters of the ocean as in a water-skin * and stores up the depths of the sea. Let all the earth fear the Lord; * let all who dwell in the world stand in awe of him.

We will pray the Psalm responsively, by whole verse.

During this hymn at the 9 am service, preschool and elementary-aged children may meet members of our Children's Ministries staff under the pulpit to travel downstairs to the Chapel for an age-appropriate children's homily. The children return to the service during The Peace.

Gospel Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners."

While he was saying these things to them, suddenly a leader of the synagogue came in and knelt before him, saying, "My daughter has just died; but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live." And Jesus got up and followed him, with his disciples. Then suddenly a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak, for she said to herself, "If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well." Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well." And instantly the woman was made well. When Jesus came to the leader's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, he said, "Go away; for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl got up. And the report of this spread throughout that district.



The Great Thanksgiving



Invitation

The Gifts of God for the People of God.

Trinity Church and The Episcopal Diocese of Massachusetts welcome all to Holy Communion. If instead of the sacrament in either kind you prefer to receive a blessing in the name of God, cross your arms over your chest. With that cue, a priest will offer a short prayer.

To receive the sacrament, come to the altar rail; stand or kneel (as you are able or as your piety prefers); and extend your hands, one inside the other. In turn, the priest will place a consecrated wafer in your open palm. If you require a gluten-free wafer, please request one from the priest offering Communion.

A Eucharistic Minister will follow with the wine; to receive, help guide the chalice to your lips. The server wipes the chalice's rim after every sip.

For those who find it easier to remain in their pew, please signal an Usher, and a priest will bring the sacrament to you.
